

After that, the State Party must submit a report every 5 years called Periodic Reports Within 2 years of joining the CRC, they must submit an Initial

Report to a committee at the UN on their child rights implementation



UN Committee reviews these reports, listens to the voice of different people and checks how well the country is upholding the CRC This Committee is called the Committee on the Rights of the Child

After getting the opinions of various parties, the UN Committee conducts a Session with the government to discuss the report submitted

20 December 2006

Malaysia submitted its Initial Report on child rights to the UN Committee

2 February 2007

UN Committee responded with Concluding Observations to improve child rights

5 August 2021

Malaysia submitted a combined 2nd-4th Periodic Report
